


Introduction

This student handbook is designed to provide prospective students with information about the study options and services provided by ECA Maritime College.

The first section of the handbook will give information on the specific courses and provide details on course prerequisites and requirements to receive your certificate. This section will include information from AMSA, including qualifying sea service, eyesight test, medical fitness, and the template for a Commonwealth Statutory Declaration.

The second section of the handbook will give information about being a student, your rights, and responsibilities, as well as information on RPL, payment expectations, refunds, etc.





With an overall length of 52 feet and weighing 32 tons, she is powered by two 460 HP diesel engines and fitted with various sophisticated electronics. These include a FLIR Thermal Imaging camera, a Radio Directional Finder, several GPS plotters, Radar Controls in 2 stations, and duplicated VHF and HF radios. Specially built to operate as a rescue vessel in the harsh environment of the North Sea, the Daniel Thain is one of the best-equipped and safest training vessels. She is self-righting and constructed with many watertight compartments, which makes her ideal for teaching purposes.

She is currently used as a training vessel in all courses offered by ECA Maritime College. IMPORTANT NOTICE: COVID-19 AND PRACTICAL ASSESSMENTS

Certificates in the Maritime Training Package require practical assessments to be completed as part of the curriculum.

As a part of our Registered Training Organisation registration, we must meet all the standards per the Department of Education and Australian Maritime Safety Authority.

Therefore, we cannot complete any curriculum and issue any Certificates without these standards being met as per our registration; if we fail to conduct these assessments, we are operating outside of our registration and risk losing our accreditation. If we lose our accreditation, we will no longer be able to issue any Certification.

While we understand the frustration COVID is causing, please be assured that we are just as frustrated and work hard every day to accommodate our students. All students must attend our Brisbane campus to complete the practical assessments relating to their course(s) to meet the requirements posed to all RTOs.

Should the borders be closed when we have the practical assessment booked, a new time will be allocated. There is no exception for ANY student/s to bypass attending Brisbane to complete the practical assessment.

We can offer Students an extension to their Course should these closures cause delays in completion. However, this will be case-by-case and will not apply across the board.

Qualification Description

This qualification applies to people working in the maritime industry seeking an Australian Maritime Safety Authority (AMSA) certificate of competency to command and operate the engines of a vessel:

• <12 m in length with propulsion power that is unlimited for an outboard engine or <500 kW for an inboard engine that is, in inshore waters or designated waters

or

- as a tender or auxiliary vessel within 3 nautical miles (nm) of a parent vessel within the exclusive economic zone (EEZ).
- Licensing/Regulatory Information

This qualification is required to obtain an AMSA certificate of competency as a Coxswain Grade 1 NC as defined in the National Standard for Commercial Vessels (NSCV) Part D.

AMSA certification will require:

- achieving MAR20321 Certificate II in Maritime Operations (Coxswain Grade 1 Near Coastal)
- a Marine Radio Operator VHF Certificate of Proficiency

sea service consisting of:

• 30 days qualifying sea service and a completed AMSA-approved task book;

or

- 240 days qualifying sea service
- meeting the medical and eyesight requirements specified in the NSCV Part D and
- assessment by an AMSA-approved assessor using the AMSA-mandated practical assessment (AMPA) conducted on a commercial vessel ≥5.0 m in length.

as a tender or auxiliary vessel within 3 nm of a parent vessel within the exclusive economic zone (EEZ)

with propulsion power that is unlimited for an outboard engine or <100 kW for an inboard engine

that is not carrying passengers.

Licensing/Regulatory Information

This qualification is required to obtain an AMSA certificate of competency as a Coxswain Grade 2 NC as defined in the National Standard for Commercial Vessels (NSCV) Part D.

AMSA certification will require:

achieving MAR10418 Certificate I in Maritime Operations (Coxswain Grade 2 Near Coastal) sea service consisting of:

7 days qualifying sea service and a completed AMSA approved task book or

60 days qualifying sea service

meeting the medical and eyesight requirements specified in the NSCV Part D and assessment by an AMSA approved assessor using the AMSA mandated practical assessment (AMPA) conducted on a vessel ≥5.0 m in length.

Coxswain Grade 3 Near Coastal

This certificate will allow you to:

Command and operate the engines of a vessel less than 12 metres long with outboard engine propulsion less than 250 kW, or inboard engines less than 100 kilowatts

Carrying no more than 6 persons including crew and master

In daylight hours only, if carrying passengers

Operating within the following:

A marina

A mooring area in sight and communication of a marina

Inland waters

Smooth waters

Within I nautical mile of shore

Inside or within I nautical mile of an aquaculture lease or in waters approved for daily transit to and from an aquaculture lease

Command and operate the engines of a tender less than 12 metres long with outboard engine propulsion less than 250 kW, or inboard engines less than 100 kilowatts In daylight hours only, if carrying passengers

Operating within either:

If you have completed the Maritime Training Package units: 3 nautical miles of a parent vessel within the exclusive economic zone and in line of sight of the parent vessel; or If you hold a recreational boat licence, RYA Powerboat level 2 course or Australian Sailing Powerboat Handling course: 1 nautical mile of a parent vessel within the exclusive economic zone and in line of sight of the parent vessel

This certificate will also allow you to:

Command and operate the engines of a vessel less than 12 metres long with propulsion power for inboard or outboard engine of up to 500 kW

That is used only for towing people

In daylight hours only

In waters approved as a water ski area by a State or Territory authority.

Eligibility

To be eligible for a Coxswain grade 3 near coastal certificate you must:

Be at least 16 years old on the certificate issue date

Be able to speak and understand English, including written documents

Be medically fit for the duties, including eyesight

Gain any needed sea service

Complete any needed on-water practical tasks

Hold a recreational boat licence, issued by a State or Territory, or complete a training option listed under 'new certificate'

Coxswain grade 3 near coastal is a domestic certificate of competency issued under Marine Order 505 (Certificates of competency — national law) 2022.

DELIVERY METHOD / COURSE FEE

Virtual Classroom Delivery – these classes are completed via Zoom. You will need to have Zoom uploaded to your computer and have an internet connection, webcam, and microphone before the exam commences.

Virtual classes are run five days a week, Monday to Friday, with classes starting at 0800 and finishing at 1600, for two weeks.

While we have allocated course durations for our Virtual classes, depending on the group, it may be completed sooner.

It is your responsibility to complete your assignments during the course or once the course has finished should you not have time during the course.

If you cannot attend a scheduled session, you must advise us as soon as possible and arrange to catch up in your own time.

As part of the maritime training package curriculum, each course holds a Practical Assessment component, and students must attend our Brisbane Campus to complete this.

ALL students MUST complete the Practical assessment.



This includes a non-refundable deposit of \$1000.00* (upon receiving training material - electronic or hard copy) to be paid upon enrolment. The remainder of the outstanding fees payable must be finalised seven days before the course start date.









Remote / Flexible Delivery - Correspondence

If you only have time to attend some classes, you can continue your study remotely and will have 12 months from your start date to complete it. You must have enrolled and paid your course deposit. You can then be given access to the student portal, which holds all the course content and assignments.

Your assignments are all completed through our Learning Management System. Your designated assessor will offer feedback through the same system.






Once Remote students have completed all their assignments, they need to contact brisbane@ecamaritimecollege.edu.au to organise a time to complete their written exams. All written exams must be completed before the Practical Assessment.

We can only issue a certificate with ALL curriculum components being satisfied; this includes the Practical Assessment.

ECA Maritime College offers the Practical Assessment and AMPA completion as a collaborative; however, students who choose not to complete their AMPA with us will still need to satisfy the Practical assessment component.



Online Exams

Our exams are completed online via Zoom. You will need to have uploaded Zoom to your computer and have an internet connection, webcam, and microphone before the exam commences.

Bookings Required

Exams are held three mornings a week, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, from 8.30 am - 12.30 pm for our remote and correspondent students. All the other students will have their exams during your class time.

If you need to book, please email with a minimum of 24 hours' notice the date, time, and Unit of Competency exam you wish to sit. We will endeavor to accommodate but there may also be times when we will offer you an alternative booking.

You will be emailed an "Online Exam Procedure" document when your first exam time has been booked.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS and HOW TO ENROL

Regulatory authorities have a minimum age requirement of 16 years before the assessment to meet licensing regulations within their jurisdiction. However, training may commence before this.

COURSE DEPOSITS – AS AT 1st January 2023

ALL COURSES will require a non-refundable deposit of \$1,000.00 plus any resources as required. This will need to be paid before you get your placement and receive your resource pack.

VIRTUAL CLASSROOM STUDENTS - A non-refundable deposit of \$1000.00 plus any resources required to be paid on enrolment, with the remainder of the fees to be paid in full before course commencement.

REMOTE STUDENTS – A non-refundable deposit of \$1000.00 plus any resources as required to be paid on enrolment, with the remaining fees payable in 5 monthly installments or as agreed upon enrolment.

RPL – requires a \$1000.00 application fee which will be deducted from your overall course fees once your training plan has been determined.



Remote / Online Students – Please note: We can assess anywhere in Australia. However, any assessments required to be undertaken offsite from our Brisbane campus will be provided with an ASSESSMENT QUOTE. This is to cover travel and accommodation costs of Assessors when necessary.

So that you know, any coursework submitted will remain unprocessed if your course fees are overdue. A late payment could cause your enrollment to be canceled and any outstanding fees sent to a debt collection agency.

Competency-based training (CBT)

CBT training and assessment is a flexible form of training that aims to produce a workforce with the knowledge and skills that which industry requires.

The cornerstone of CBT is the competency standards in the Industry Training Package. The concept of competency focuses on what is expected of an employee in the workplace rather than on the learning process, and embodies the ability to transfer and apply skills and knowledge to new situations and environments.

Competency is a broad concept that includes all aspects of work performance and narrow task skills. Vet courses are made up of multiple units of competency. Each unit of competency describes the skills and knowledge required in the workplace.

Students undertaking training and assessment receive a competent result when successful workplace performance is demonstrated.

Students may request access to personal records at any time. Requests to view personal records should be made in writing. ECA Maritime only permits access to records by students, student-authorised parties, and ECA staff. Our staff members need to access your records to update your training or assessment program, to record training is undertaken and assessment outcomes, qualifications, and related data, and to gather information for reporting purposes.



Prior knowledge and/or skills

Recognition of qualifications issued by other Registered Training Organisations (RTOs) is usually for the purposes of entry into a qualification where another qualification or certain Statements of Attainment are a prerequisite to entry, or for part completion of a qualification based on Statements of Attainment for the units already held by the student. It is mandatory that RTOs accept the qualifications and Statements of Attainment issued by other RTOs. Recognition of qualifications issued by other Registered Training Organisations does not require an RTO to recognise the qualifications/Statements of Attainment for any purposes other than training with that RTO, such as licensing or employment arrangements, e.g. industrial award classifications. Recognition of qualifications issued by another RTO does have a limited lifespan. If the qualification/Statement of Attainment is currently listed on training.gov.au and is still a component of a qualification that the student wishes to undertake, recognition of qualifications issued by another RTO must be given. This Policy does not apply if the qualification/Statement of Attainment held by the student has been superseded and is no longer on training.gov.au or is not the version required by the qualification into which the student wished to enrol. In such situations, Recognition of Prior Learning would be the appropriate way to proceed.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)

RPL is the acknowledgement of a person's skills and knowledge acquired through previous training, work or life experience, which may be used to grant status or credit in a subject or module.

It can lead to a full qualification in the VET sector and available for all Units of Competency. The learning outcomes of each unit provide the RPL benchmarks. Students may receive full recognition for the competencies required for a course or module. Students requesting RPL must first apply. The application will require supporting documentation and certificates (Certified Copies) that can then be uploaded to be assessed. There is a non-refunable application fee of \$1000. Once the RPL process has been completed, applicants will be notified promptly of the RPL outcome.

Credit transfer

NCVER define Credit Transfer as "the granting of status or credit by an institution or training organisation to students for modules (subjects) or units of competency completed at the same or another institution or training organisation." An applicant may already hold units of competence that can contribute toward a qualification delivered by ECA Maritime. Credit Transfer is the process that may result in recognition of the units of competence towards a qualification. National and State regulators may place restrictions on

may place restrictions on accepting recognition for a unit of competence for licensing depending on the currency of competence and whether the provider who delivered the training and assessment is an approved provider.

If you wish to claim credit transfer prior to starting your course please send certified copies (NOT ORIGINALS) of qualification/statement of attainment that contain the unit of competence you wish to claim for credit transfer to

Recognition of Experience and Education



Assessment

Assessment means collecting evidence and making judgments on whether competency has been achieved to confirm that an individual can perform to the standard required in the workplace, as specified in a training package or VET-accredited course. ECA recognises that assessment is a core service offered to our students and is at the center of our operation as a Registered Training Organisation. Quality assessment ensures that the skills and knowledge of candidates are assessed using four principal determinants:

- that assessment decisions are based on the assessment of skills and knowledge compared with units of competency drawn from nationally endorsed Training Packages or accredited courses
- that the target industry or enterprise requirements are contextualised and integrated within the assessment
- that evidence is gathered that meets the rules of evidence
- that assessment is conducted following the principles of assessment

Practical Assessments

ALL students must have all assignments and exams completed before attending the Brisbane Campus for practical examinations. On successful completion, your paperwork is finalised to process your certification.

Students who miss an assessment

Students who do not attend an assessment must negotiate with their course coordinator to reschedule. If the assessment is missed due to medical grounds, rescheduling options will be given on agreement between the course coordinator and the student and at the convenience of the organisation. Please discuss with the course coordinator regarding any rescheduled assessment.

Student evidence collection - privacy

As a registered training organisation, ECA needs to see and collect a range of evidence to deem candidates competent. Sometimes, this requires the sighting of confidential student or company information.

ECA is bound by the Privacy Act 1998, and all records are secure and confidential wherever possible.

Suppose you have privacy concerns regarding your information or records. In that case, you should discuss these concerns with your course coordinator and find alternative sources of evidence to complete your course program.

The AMPA is conducted to ensure students have gained the correct and appropriate operational skills and knowledge, and knowledge of Australian Maritime Legislation; in correspondence with the course completed.

The initial Practical assessment is assessed by ECA Maritime College staff, and if satisfactory an application must be submitted to AMSA within 12 months from the date the AMPA Practical assessment was completed.

SEA TIME

A part of our Delivery and Assessment Strategy requires you to provide your sea time application before certification.

Your Sea Time accumulation provides ECA Maritime College evidence of practical experience onboard a commercial vessel and a substantial practical component of the D & A Strategy.

Without this information, you will need to complete a much larger practical component. You'll need to provide 50% of the minimum amount according to the ASMA Sea Time Requirement for the license you are applying for and pay the necessary practical day training fee for each day required. Sea time will also need to be provided for students to receive the final AMPA examination documentation.

Issuing your qualification or Statement of Attainment

When issuing certification, ECA must:

- the issue promptly (AQF certification documentation must be issued within 30 calendar days of the student's final assessment being completed or their exiting their course, providing all fees have been paid and all pre-requisites have been received. This is so you can provide proof of your competence to employers (or potential employers) while processing your application to obtain your industry license.
- issue AQF certification documentation directly to the student, not to another party, such as an employer
- issue students who have completed all units or modules in qualification with a Certificate and a record of results
- issue a student who has completed one or more units/modules (but not a full qualification) and has finished their training with your RTO with a statement of attainment

REFUND RULES, TRANSFER RULES

If the Campus cancels a program/subject before its commencement date, any fees paid by the student will be refunded in full.

If a student cancels their enrolment 15 days or more before the commencement of their course, they are entitled to a refund of fees paid - less a 15% administration fee of the total course fees.

If a student cancels their enrolment within 6 to 14 days before the commencement of their course, they are entitled to a refund of fees paid - less a 25% administration fee of the total course fees.

If a student cancels their enrolment within five days or less before the commencement of their course, no refund of fees paid will be given, and payment of the full course fee will still be required.

If students withdraw from an active course, they forfeit all fees paid and are still liable to pay the full course fee.

If a student cannot attend the course, an approved suitable delegate is welcome at no extra charge.

If a student cannot continue attending the course they have started due to health issues, requests for a refund will require a medical certificate. Cancellation and Administrative fees will apply and be deducted from any approved refund.
